

## WSH Horse Shows

WSH Shows are open to anyone who is interested in showing their horse. Our shows have classes for everyone including Novice all the way to Advanced. Our shows are designed so that the entire family can come and have a fun day participating together.

Not only do we offer different breed classes but we also offer several age divisions. Our shows include Western and English performance classes, Equitation and Pleasure classes, as well as Reining, Working Rancher, Trail, Showmanship and Halter.

WSH offers Year-End Awards in 2 different categories including "A" System & "B" System. This means that if you are an "A" System rider you can win WSH Awards by continuing to show at the shows you normally show at. There is no need to attend any "B" System shows.

On the other hand, those who choose to ride "B" System don't have to attend "A" System shows to receive WSH awards.

We award over 218 Awards at our State Convention in November. We also have over 81 Perpetual Trophies. WSH awards Jackets to the Top 5 Horse & Rider Combination. For each award the exhibitor signs up for, points are computed from their top eight shows. Shows are held all throughout the State so it is easy to find one in the area where you live. Costs usually range between \$10 and \$15 per class for a double judged show which means that if you place you are getting 2 sets of awards.

WSH also offers a Register of Merit Program which is similar to those offered by Breed organizations, where exhibitors can work towards winning prizes including certificates, horse blankets, Jackets, vests & custom made Belt buckles. Points are accumulated over time and can be carried over from one year to the next.

### Divisions

We have several Divisions the Exhibitors can compete in:

All Other Breeds, Appaloosa, Arabian/Half-Arabian, Buckskin, Driving, English, Equitation, Hunter-Jumper, Miniature Horse, Morgan, Novice Rider/Horse, Paint/Solid Bred Breeding Stock Paint, Pony, Pinto, Quarter Horse, Reining, Limit, Walk-Trot/Leadline, and Western.



**DRESSAGE**-WSH also has a Dressage /Western Dressage/Eventing Division that offers "B" System Awards. The levels that are offered:

Training Level, First Level, Second Level, Third Level,, Fourth Level, PSF, Intermediate I & II, Grand Prix and Musical Freestyle.

For the Eventing/Horse Trials, we offer Beginner Novice, Novice Level, Training Level, Preliminary Level, and Intermediate Level.
