Horse Show Division

WSH B-System shows are fun for the whole family, and open to all breeds. We offer English and Western classes from novice to advanced - with halter, showmanship, trail, driving, hunter-jumper, reining, and working rancher - to name a few. We have classes for all ages, including 6 & under Leadline, 8 & under "walk-whoa," and 10 & under walk/trot. We also offer dressage shows! Visit our webpage to find a horse show near you.

Sign up for our year-end awards to be eligible for more than 80 perpetual trophies for both A and B-System shows, with awards in over 140 classes, plus dressage awards. We also have an incredible ROM Program - similar to breed organizations - where exhibitors can earn certificates, jackets, horse blankets and belt buckles. Points are accumulated over time and can be carried over from year to year.

Trails and Pleasure

The Trails and Pleasure division is comprised of a group of horsemen that find owning a horse a pleasure, and riding them on trails a relaxing hobby. Safety is stressed on the trails, both for humans and livestock. We keep up on trail conditions as the information becomes available, and share with our members.

Each year, our riders submit their number of hours ridden; this riding information is used by different agencies to track trail use by horsemen. For the rider, it's just fun to see how many hours they can ride in a year. All riding, in-hand and driving time counts, including arena, pleasure and trail riding (travel time, grooming, saddling/harnessing times do not count; nor do competitive times in the saddle - shows, endurance etc.)
