PINK RIBBON CLASSIC (One Horse & Rider per Entry Form)

RELEASE, WAIVER, HOLD HARMLESS, DEFEND AND INDEMNIFICATION AGREEMENT. THIS DOCUMENT AFFECTS YOUR LEGAL RIGHTS SO PLEASE READ CAREFULLY BEFORE SIGNING

The undersigned, as a Participant/Spectator/Visitor/Horse Owner/Contractor/Volunteer (collectively "Participant"), on his/her own behalf .and, if applicable, as the Parent/Legal Guardian of a minor Participant, for good and valuable consideration, agrees to the terms and conditions of this Release, Waiver, Hold Harmless, Defend, and Indemnification Agreement ("Release").

- Assumption of Risk and Waiver: Participant understands and accepts the risks of engaging in Equine Activities, while mounted or unmounted, as well as merely being near a horse, pony, mule, donkey, or hinny (collectively "equine"), include, but are in no way limited to, faulty equipment or tack that cause injury or death. Released Parties' failure to make a reasonable effort to determine the ability of Participant to engage safely in an equine activity or to safely manage the particular equine provided based on Participant's representations of his or her ability. Released Parties' failure to conspicuously post warning signs of a dangerous inconspicuous condition on the real property, as well as: (1) the propensity of an equine to behave in a way that may result in injury or death to a person on or near it (ex.: jump, run, kick, buck, bolt, spin, rear up, strike, bite, stumble, fall, etc.); (2) the unpredictability of an equine's reaction to a sound (ex.: doors opening and closing, snow and ice falling, rain, wind, thunder, voices, music, guns, planes, cars, trucks, etc.), movement, or unfamiliar object (ex.: machinery, equipment, obstacles, buggies, carts, barrels, ground poles, cones, flowers, flags, golf carts, mini-bikes, whips, bats, construction material, etc.), person or animal (ex.: leashed or unleashed dogs, ducks, wildlife, equines, etc.); (3) a collision with an object or another animal (ex.: mounted equine, loose equine, etc.); (4) the potential for a person participating in an equine activity to act in a negligent manner, to fail to control the equine or to not act within his or her ability; and (5) natural hazards, including surface and subsurface conditions (ex.: ground holes, uneven terrain, slippery or deep footing, etc.). Participant agrees that engaging in Equine Activities under this Release includes, but is in no way limited to, those defined in the Washington Equine Activity Liability Statute, WA ST 4.24.530 et seq., as well as riding another's equine, petting, guiding, leading, mounting, feeding, watching, and otherwise interacting with or merely being in the vicinity of equines (collectively "Equine Activities"). Participant understands the injuries, death, loss, and damage that may result from the inherent risks of engaging in Equine Activities or just being near equines, that equines are powerful and have the potential to be dangerous, even without warning, and that the risks listed in this Release is just a sampling and Participant is not relying on Released Parties (defined below) to list all possible equine-related risks. Participant understands that Washington State Horseman Horse Show Division ("WSH HSD") requires the wearing of an ASTM/SEI-certified equestrian helmet ("Helmet") consistent with the Washington State Horsemen rules. Participant understands and agrees that failing to wear a Helmet while engaged in Equine Activities increases the risk of serious injury and/or death, Participant is not relying on Released Parties to provide a Helmet, check a Helmet or its harness strap for proper fitting, or monitor the wearing of a Helmet at any time now or in the future. Participant understands and agrees that Participant has other riding associations and facilities to choose from, he/she has inspected the facility for the Equine Activities and is satisfied that all are reasonable and safe for Participant's intended use, he/she is voluntarily engaging in Equine Activities, he/she is directly and intentionally engaging in and assuming the risks of Equine Activities, and he/she agrees to at all times to be responsible for his/her personal safety. Participant agrees to purchase and maintain his/her health and liability insurance, remain responsible for his/her medical expenses, and waives his/her right to any claims arising from his/her participation in or observation of any Equine Activities, being near equines, or merely being present on real property owned, leased, rented, borrowed, visited, or otherwise occupied or utilized by Released Parties, "Released Parties" herein includes the Washington State Horseman Horse Show Division, its members, officers, directors, employees, contractors, and their respective family members, heirs, agents, trustees, beneficiaries, employees, working students, volunteers, independent contractors, clinicians, quests, visitors, invitees, partners, members, managers, officers, directors, owners, lessors, lessees, licensors, licensees, and others acting on their behalf.
- 2. **Release, Hold Harmless, Defend, Indemnify:** Participant agrees to release, hold harmless, defend, and indemnify Released Parties for any illness, injury, death, damage, or other loss (collectively "Loss") incurred by Participant or to Participant's property and/or equine, even if such Loss is caused in whole or in part by negligence or other fault of Participant or Released Parties (except gross negligence, or reckless or willful and wanton conduct). This Release shall not expire and shall remain in full force and effect in perpetuity.
- 3. Governing Law, Jurisdiction, Time/Liability Limitation, Attorneys' Fees, Jury Waiver: This Release shall be construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of Washington. All disputes relating to the interpretation and enforcement of this Release shall be resolved by the state court in Pierce County, Washington. Participant agrees that any and all claims for Loss by Participant against Released Parties must be brought within one (1) year of the date accrued and any surviving claim for personal property Loss is limited to two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250). Participant agrees to reimburse Released Parties for any and all attorneys' fees and costs incurred by Released Parties in enforcing the terms of this Release and/or in defending or prosecuting any claims or causes of action involving or relating to Participant agrees to waive trial by jury in any action with Released Parties.
- 4. **Severability, Modification:** If any provision of this Release is deemed invalid or unenforceable, the remaining provisions shall be valid and enforceable to the fullest extent of the law. The Release can only be modified if signed by Participant and WSH HSD Director.
- 5. **Certification:** Participant certifies he/she read this Release and understands that signing this Release is required for Participant to participate in Equine Activities with Released Parties, knows that he/she has other instructors, facilities and/or horses to choose from, and voluntarily intends on his/her own behalf, and on behalf of minor Participant, and Participant's spouse, parents, family members, heirs, agents, trustees, beneficiaries, representatives, successors, and assigns, to be bound by the terms and conditions contained herein.

~ GENERAL RULES ~

AGE: The age of an Exhibitor on December 1 shall be maintained the entire year. Persons born on December 1 assume the greater age on that date. A Junior Exhibitor has not reached his/her 19th birthday on December 1. A Senior exhibitor is 19 years or over on December I. Any Horse is considered to be one year old on the first day of January following the actual date of foaling. A Junior Horse is one that is five years of age or younger, a Senior Horse is six years of age & over.

AMATEUR CLASSES: To enter any Amateur designated class, WSH Horse Shows accept ApHC, ABRA, AQHA, AMHA, APHA, PtHA, NRHA, WSH, or USEF Amateur Cards/Non-Pro Card. WSH Amateur Status is defined as participants 19 years of age and older. An application for a WSH Amateur Card can be made at the Show Office. WSH Amateur Cards are: \$12 for WSH Non-Members not participating in the WSH High Score Awards, free to WSH Members participating in at least 2 WSH High Point Awards (does not mean Zone Awards). Please include a photocopy of your card with your entry or bring a photocopy to the Show Office to be left on file with your entry; presenting your original card for review is no longer an option. Entry into any Amateur designated class will not be processed until the required photocopy or a completed WSH Amateur Card Application with paid fee has been received.

AWARDS: Trophy to 1st Place, ribbons to 6th Place in all classes. Participation prizes to all Leadline Exhibitors.

CAMPING/PARKING: Camper and trailer parking will be available in designated areas and are on a first come/first served basis. Electrical hookups are available, but only a limited number have water hookups. Dry Camping includes tents, trailers, campers, and the like that are not hooked up but used for overnight stays. Anyone camping must possess a camping pass or obtain one from the Show Secretary. If a camping pass is not obtained, you will be asked to leave the grounds immediately.

CHAMPIONSHIP CLASSES: Entries must be entered, shown, and judged in one of the listed qualifying classes to be eligible to compete in the Championship class. See the class list for the designated qualifying classes. If an Exhibitor fails to show in the qualifying class, they can trade their Championship class Entry Fee to another class; no refunds will be given.

CHANGES: Show Management reserves the right to cancel or combine classes when it does not affect WSH points. Exhibitors will be notified if classes are combined or canceled.

CLASS ENTRIES: Entries must be made at the Show Office at least five (5) classes in advance and cannot be accepted at the gate. Entries for all Halter and Showmanship classes will close fifteen (15) minutes before the start of the morning session.

CHECK POLICY: Checks returned for any reason will be assessed a \$50 processing fee.

CONDUCT by WSH Members, Non-Members, Exhibitors, Trainers, Owner's Representatives, Spectators, and all other persons present on the show grounds shall be orderly, responsible, sportsmanlike, and humane in the treatment of their Horses. Unsportsmanlike or irresponsible conduct, or any other form of misconduct that is illegal, indecent, profane, intimidating, threatening, harassing, or abusive is prohibited, as is the inhumane treatment of Horses. Show Management may immediately expel offenders from the show grounds, forfeiting all prizes and awards with no refund of fees paid. Show Management reserves the right to refuse any entry of an Exhibitor or the participation of an Agent, Trainer, Rider or Handler who has shown an objectionable attitude toward a Recognized Show or previous un-sportsman like behavior at a Recognized Show or to its Management. They may ask anyone on the grounds to leave at any time for any reason. This is a private function, and you may be asked to leave and are expected to vacate the premises immediately if asked.

CROSS ENTRY: Exhibitors may <u>not</u> share a Horse in Pleasure classes divided by Rider's age or in Trail classes. Exhibitors in different age divisions may share a Horse for Equitation classes but only one Exhibitor/Horse combination will be eligible to show in combined age division Championship classes.

DOGS must always be on a leash and controlled by the Owner. No dogs will be allowed in the Exposition Building or warm-up arena (except during the dog races).

ENTRY FEES are non-refundable for missed or scratched classes and will not be deducted from the amount owing on an Open Checks. Exhibitors will be allowed to transfer Entry Fees from one class to another provided the trade is submitted to the Show Office on the appropriate form at least five (5) classes prior to the first class being traded. Entry Fees for classes entered during the show must be paid for at the time of entry unless a signed, blank check is already on file in the Show Office.

ENTRY FORMS must be plainly printed or typed and signed by the Owner or Authorized Agent, the Rider or Handler, and any Coach or Trainer. A Parent or Guardian signature is required if the Rider or Handler is a Junior Exhibitor. Exhibitor Numbers will not be released until all required parties have signed. Entries will not be accepted without payment for all applicable Class Entry, Post Entry, Office, Camping or RV Hookup, Stall or Tackroom Fees. Open Checks cannot be accepted as payment for initial entries. Please circle only those classes you are submitting payment for. Exhibitors sharing the same horse must each be entered in the show on a separate Entry Form. Please include photocopies of your: 1) WSH Membership Card, 2) Current ApHC, ABRA, AQHA, AMHA, APHA, PtHA, NRHA Non-Pro or WSH, USEF Amateur Card if entering Amateur designated classes, and 3) Horse's

registration papers only if you are competing for WSH's Breed High Score Awards this year. Please pay only one Stall and/or Tackroom, Dry Camp or RV Hookup per Entry Form; please do not split fees or pay another Exhibitor's fees on your entry.

EXHIBITORS must appear in the ring suitably attired, with the correct number on their backs or on both sides of the saddle pad, clearly visible to the Judge at all times when in competition. Exhibitors in any 'In Hand' classes may wear their number in front. Entries with wrong/missing numbers will be disqualified.

GATE HOLDS are limited to a maximum of three (3) minutes and are granted can be requested if a Horse or Exhibitor is in two (2) consecutive/back-to-back classes with a different Horse or Exhibitor. The In-Gate will not be closed any sooner than two (2) minutes after the last Horse exits the ring from the previous class unless all entries for the next class are present. No Exhibitor will be allowed to enter the ring once the gate is closed.

JUDGE: The decision of the Judges is final. No one shall approach the Judge with regard to a decision unless he/she first obtains permission from the Show Committee or the Steward who shall arrange an appointment with the Judge at a proper time and place.

OFFICE FEE: \$10 per Entry (Horse & Rider combination). Riders entered ONLY in Leadline or the Walk/Trot 10 Yrs. & Under classes do not pay the Office Fee.

OPEN CHECKS are a courtesy for Exhibitors that have already paid to enter the show who intend to enter additional classes during the show, with the understanding that classes once entered will be charged, and that missed or scratched classes will not be deducted from any amount owing.

POST ENTRIES: A flat fee of \$10 per Horse for Pink Ribbon and \$15 per Horse for Eddie MacMurdo owed on entries not received/postmarked by the Pre-Entry Deadline and entered in at least one (1) class. Riders entered ONLY in Leadline or the Walk-Trot 10 Yrs. & Under classes do not pay the Post Entry Fee. Post entries will be accepted at the show until five (5) classes prior to the class being entered.

PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR: It is compulsory for all Junior Exhibitors 18 & Under riding in Hunter attire; Leadline Equitation Riders 6 & Under and Walk/Trot Riders 10 & Under (any seat) to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM/SEI standards when mounted anywhere on the competition grounds. It is mandatory for anyone of any age to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM/SEI standards any time jumping on competition grounds. No Rider of any age will be penalized for wearing protective headgear in Western classes.

PROTESTS must be made in writing, signed by the protestor, accompanied with a \$50 deposit, and addressed to the Secretary of the Competition within 48 hours of the alleged violation; OR may be made directly to the Horse Show Director, accompanied by the \$50 deposit, and received within five (5) business days following the last day of the Competition.

REFUND OF ENTRY FEES (minus the Office Fee & Stall Fee) will only be made upon receipt of a Physician's or Veterinarian's Certificate, stating the nature of the disability, and presented prior to Rider's or Horse's first class. Refunds will be mailed after the show

STABLING: Stalls must be pre-paid and are non-refundable for any reason. All Horses using a stall on the grounds or staying overnight must pay a Stall Fee. Stalls are available from Friday at Noon through 6:00pm Sunday. Stalls will include one bag of shavings; additional pine shavings are available for purchase for \$10 per bag. No stalls will be reserved until payment is received with a completed entry form. Those desiring adjacent stalls must indicate and, if possible, submit entries together. No change of assigned stalls permitted without prior permission from the Show Manager.

WSH MEMBERSHIP CARDS & NON-MEMBER FEES: Please include a photocopy of your Membership Card with your entry. Members who do not include a photocopy of their cards with their entry and are unable to present their card at the Show Office must pay the \$3 WSH Non-Member Fee per Judge at each Show and a Horse Owner or Non-Owner Equitation Rider/Showmanship Handler who is not a WSH Member must pay the \$3 Non-Member Fee per Judge at each Show; only one fee per Owner is required to be paid regardless of the number of Equines owned or shown. Exhibitors under the age of 18 may show a family-owned Equine as "Owner" and the registered Owner is not required to be a WSH Member or pay the Non-Member Fee. A family member is defined as: Parent, Aunt, Uncle, Grandparent, Sibling, Niece, Nephew, Cousin, or Legal Guardian; Stepparents, Aunts & Uncles, Grandparents and Half or Step Siblings included.

~ 4-H/WAHSET/OHSET MEMBER CLASSES ~

Exhibitors must be current members of an active 4-H Club, a Washington High School or an Oregon High School Equestrian Team. Performance, knowledge of horsemanship, attitude of the member, and condition of equine and tack will be taken into

consideration. Riders are required to wear an ASTM/SEI approved helmet in all under-saddle 4-H/WAHSET/OHSET classes. English Pleasure and Equitation classes may be ridden in either Hunter Seat, Saddle Seat or Dressage tack and attire. Chaps are optional in the Western Pleasure and Equitation classes.

4-H/WAHSET/OHSET Fitting & Showing (No WSH Pts.)

Exhibitors will be asked to demonstrate their ability to lead, turn, set-up, and move their Horse as the Judge requests. Individual tests may include backing, forehand or haunch turns, side pass, lead at the walk or jog/trot from either side, stop and set-up. The Quartering System will be used. May show in Hunter attire with appropriate Hunt bridle, Saddle Seat attire with appropriate bridle or show halter, or Western attire with appropriate show halter. Whips are not permitted

4-H/WAHSET/OHSET English Equitation (No WSH Pts.)

Exhibitors enter the ring at the trot, and will perform both ways of the ring at the walk, trot, and canter. The order to reverse for Exhibitors riding Hunter Seat must be executed by turning away from the rail; Exhibitors riding Saddle Seat may reverse by turning either to or away from the rail. Exhibitors may be asked to perform a specific test or pattern; tests or patterns may consist of but are not limited to the following: extended or sitting trot, hand gallop, figure eights or serpentines at the trot or canter, back, halts, dropping irons, picking up reins in line.

4-H/WAHSET/OHSET English Pleasure (No NEZ or WSH Pts.)

Horses to be shown both ways of the ring at the walk, trot can canter; may be asked to extend the trot. The order to reverse is executed by turning away from the rail. Horses may be asked to back in the line-up. Horses shown Hunter Seat are judged on suitability to purpose, head carriage, gait, and control; bit contact should be maintained. Horses shown Saddle Seat are judged on performance and ability to give a good pleasure ride with emphasis on style, manners, and gait; bit contact must be maintained.

4-H/WAHSET/OHSET Western Equitation (No WSH Pts.)

Exhibitors enter the ring at the walk, and will perform both ways of the ring at the walk, jog, and lope. The order to reverse is executed by turning away from the rail. Exhibitors will be required to back their Horses. Individual tests or patterns may be asked for, and may consist of but are not limited to the following: extended jog or lope, forehand or haunch turns, riding without stirrups, figure eights or serpentines at any gait.

4-H/WAHET/OHSET Western Pleasure (No NEZ or WSH Pts.)

Horses to be shown both ways of the ring at the walk, jog, and lope; may be asked to extend the jog. The order to reverse is executed by turning away from the rail. Horses may be asked to back in the line-up. Judged on manners, performance, and suitability to give a good pleasure ride.

~ PAIRS CLASSES ~

Walk-Trot English Pairs, Open (No NEZ or WSH Pts.)

Judged at a walk and trot both ways of the ring. Exhibitors will be asked to back as a pair in the line-up. Performance as a team and similarity as a pair will be considered in placing of this class.

Walk-Jog Western Pairs, Open (No NEZ or WSH Pts.)

Judged at a walk and jog both ways of the ring. Exhibitors will be asked to back as a pair in the line-up. Performance as team and similarity as a pair will be considered in placing of this class.

~ ALL OTHER BREEDS CLASSES ~

Breed registration is not required. Stock Type Horses are of predominately Appaloosa, Paint Horse or Quarter Horse breeding or similar conformation. Non-Stock Type Horses are those not eligible for the Stock Type classes. No cross entry is permitted between Stock Type and Non-Stock Type. Cross entry between Walk-Jog/Trot and Canter/Lope classes is permitted.

All Other Breeds Halter, Non-Stock Type, Any Age/Sex

All Other Breeds Halter, Stock Type, Any Age/Sex

Shown to breed type. Class routine to be at the discretion of the Judge.

All Other Breeds English Pleasure, Non-Stock Type, Walk-Trot (No NEZ or WSH Pts.)

All Other Breeds English Pleasure, Stock Type, Walk-Trot (No NEZ or WSH Pts.)

Tack and attire shall be suitable to horse's type; martingale prohibited. To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk and trot/intermediate gait. Judged on manners and performance 60%; quality and conformation 30%; suitability of horse to rider 10%.

All Other Breeds English Pleasure, Non-Stock Type $\mbox{\em x}$

All Other Breeds English Pleasure, Stock Type X

Must be entered, shown and judged in these classes to be eligible for the Championship class.

All Other Breeds English Pleasure, Non-Stock/Stock Type, Championship

Tack and attire shall be suitable to horse's type; martingale prohibited. To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, trot/intermediate gait, and canter. Judged on manners and performance 60%; quality and conformation 30%; suitability of horse to rider 10%.

All Other Breeds Western Pleasure, Non-Stock Type, Walk-Jog (No NEZ or WSH Pts.)

All Other Breeds Western Pleasure, Stock Type, Walk-Jog (No NEZ or WSH Pts.)

Horses are to be shown at a flat footed four-beat walk and free moving easy riding two-beat jog both ways of the ring on a reasonably loose rein without undue restraint. Extended gaits may be called for by the Judge. Special emphasis shall be placed on the walk. Horses may be asked to back at the Judge's discretion. All horses chosen for a workout must be worked both ways of the ring at any gait requested by the Judge. Judged on performance 60%, conformation 30%, and appointments 10%.

All Other Breeds Western Pleasure, Non-Stock Type ¤

All Other Breeds Western Pleasure, Stock Type ¤

¤ Must be entered, shown, and judged in these classes to be eligible for the Championship class.

All Other Breeds Western Pleasure, Non-Stock/Stock Type, Championship

Horses are to be shown at a flat footed four-beat walk; free moving easy riding two-beat jog, and three-beat lope both ways of the ring on a reasonably loose rein without undue restraint. Extended gaits may be called for by the Judge. Entries shall be penalized for being on the wrong lead. Special emphasis shall be placed on the walk. Horses may be asked to back at Judge's discretion. All horses chosen for a workout must be worked both ways of the ring at any gait requested by the Judge. To be judged on performance 60%; conformation 30%; and appointments 10%.

~ LEADLINE & WALK/TROT 10 & UNDER CLASSES ~

Leadline Equitation, English or Western, Riders 6 & Under

Saddle Seat, Hunter Seat, or Western Seat tack and appointments. Hooded stirrups are permitted. Riders to wear an ASTM/SEI approved helmet properly fitted with harness in place at all times when mounted. Spurs are prohibited. To be led from the ground by a Senior (19 & over). Horse to be led by lead shank attached to a halter. The lead person should conform to proper English or Western attire and be consistent with the rider. To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk only. Rider may not be tied in the saddle in any way. If feet are not in the stirrups, the exhibitor may be penalized. Judged on seat, hands, and general horsemanship. Suitability of mount to rider to be considered. No cross entry to any other class in the show. (Note: Cross entry restriction is on the rider; it does not apply to the horse.)

Walk/Trot Equitation, English or Western, Riders 10 & Under

Hunter Seat, Saddle Seat or Western Seat (chaps optional); hooded stirrups permitted. Riders to wear an ASTM/SEI approved helmet properly fitted with harness in place at all times when mounted. To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk and jog/trot/intermediate gait. Not to canter/lope. Judged on seat, hands, and general horsemanship. Suitability of mount to rider to be considered. Rider may not cross enter to any lope or canter classes in the same show, except W/T Pleasure, Limit W/T or W/J Equitation or Pleasure and W/T Trail Classes. (Note: Cross entry restriction is on the rider; it does not apply to the horse.)

Walk/Trot Pleasure, English or Western, Riders 10 & Under

Riders may not cross enter to any lope or canter class in the same show. (Note: Cross entry restriction is on the rider; it does not apply to the horse.) Hunter seat, Saddle Seat or Stock Seat tack and appointments (chaps optional); hooded stirrups permitted. Riders to wear an ASTM/SEI approved helmet properly fitted with harness in place at all times when mounted. To enter at the walk and be shown both ways of the ring at a walk and jog/trot//intermediate gait; not to canter. Judged on suitability as a child's first mount 40%, manners 40%, and performance 20%.

~ ENGLISH DIVISION ~

Classes are open to horses, ponies, and mules, and may be shown by riders of any age. Junior exhibitors are restricted to mares and geldings. No cross entry is permitted between exhibitor age groups in this division. Cross entry between Walk-Trot and Walk-Trot-Canter classes is permitted.

Acceptable bits in this division include regulation snaffles (inc. twisted wire), curbs, pelhams (inc. kimberwicks), and full bridles. Prohibited bits include gag bits, mechanical hackamores, and flat polo mouthpieces. Use of prohibited bits will result in disqualification. Bit converters, martingales and tie-downs are prohibited. When using a curb with any leverage bit, it must be constructed of loose links, joints, and/or lie smooth against the jaw of the horse and be free of twists, sharp objects or anything inhumane. A curb strap or chain may be wrapped or inserted into a cover for the comfort of the horse. A curb strap or chain may not be used in conjunction with wire, metal, rawhide, metal "keepers" or any other substance except for attachment of curb strap or chain to the bit. Judges may penalize for non-conventional types of bits and nosebands.

Different breeds showing in open classes are to be shown according to their breed type. For horses being shown in Hunter tack, all

riders are required to wear protective headgear; all junior exhibitors must wear an approved ASTM/SEI protective headgear properly fastened while mounted. Unless specifically prohibited by class rule, Dressage attire and tack may be used in English Pleasure classes.

English Pleasure, Jr. Ex. 18 & Under, Walk-Trot (No NEZ or WSH pts.)

English Pleasure, Sr. Ex. 19 & Over, Walk-Trot (No NEZ or WSH pts.)

Tack and attire shall be suitable to horse's type; martingale prohibited. To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk and a trot/intermediate gait. Judged on manners and performance 60%, quality and conformation 30%, and suitability of horse to rider 10%.

English Pleasure, Jr. Ex. 18 & Under ¤

English Pleasure, Sr. Ex. 19 & Over ¤

x Must be entered, shown, and judged in these classes to be eligible for the Championship class.

English Pleasure, Jr. Ex./Sr. Ex. Championship

Tack and attire shall be suitable to horse's type; martingale prohibited. To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, trot/intermediate gait, and canter. Judged on manners and performance 60%, quality and conformation 30%, and suitability of horse to rider 10%.

English Pleasure, Jr. Horse 5 & Under

English Pleasure, Sr. Horse 6 & Over

Tack and attire shall be suitable to horse's type; martingale prohibited. To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, trot/intermediate gait, and canter. Judged on manners and performance 60%, quality and conformation 30%, and suitability of horse to rider 10%.

English Pleasure, Hunter Type, Jr. Ex. 18 & Under

English Pleasure, Hunter Type, Sr. Ex. 19 & Over

Not to jump. To be shown at a walk, trot, and canter; martingale prohibited. Judged on manners, performance, quality, and suitability of horse to rider. Light contact is recommended.

English Pleasure, Other Than Hunter Type, Open

No forward seat saddles, dressage saddle or attire and/or hunt attire allowed; martingales prohibited. Roached manes and/or set or gingered tails are prohibited. To carry a pleasure foot in accordance with Breed specifications. To be shown according to Breed type at a flat walk, trot/intermediate gait, and easy canter. Light contact must be maintained. To stand quietly and back readily. Judged 80% on manners and performance, with emphasis on a pleasurable ride, and 20% on conformation. No cross entry between age groups at the same show.

Advanced English Pleasure

To be shown at a walk, trot, and canter. A minimum of three (3) or more additional tests will be included. Some examples of tests may include, but are not limited to, extension of gaits, collection of gaits, forehand or haunch turns, back, change direction, side pass, loose rein, shoulders in or out, leg yield, 10-meter circle, counter canter and/or perform any other tests indicative of a highly trained pleasure horse. If a reverse at the canter is called for exhibitors shall reverse and proceed on the lead specified by the Judge. All horses must be allowed to attempt all requested tests. Horses should be agile, athletic, supple, prompt, willing, and show impulsion, with calmness and good manners. Judged on performance and manners. *No dropping of irons shall be permitted.

English Pleasure, Colored Horses

Open to Albino, Appaloosa, Buckskin, Dun, Grulla, Paint, Palomino, and Pinto Horses who are not shown in Non-Color Class English. Horses must show a recognizable coat and/or color pattern from a distance. Tack and attire shall be suitable to Horse's type; martingales prohibited. To be shown at a walk, trot/intermediate gait, and canter both ways of the ring. Light contact shall be maintained. Judged 40% on colorful qualities, 40% on performance, way of going and manners, and 20% on conformation.

English Pleasure, Non-Colored Horses

Open to Horses are not shown in Color Class English. Martingales prohibited. To be shown according to breed type at a flat-footed walk, trot/intermediate gait, and easy canter. Light contact must be maintained. Judged 80% on manners and performance, with emphasis on a pleasurable ride, and 20% on conformation.

English Pleasure, Green Horse 1st & 2nd Yr., Walk-Trot

Eligibility requirements are based on a horse's prior participation in any type English or Hunter classes at USE/Equine Canada/WSH and/or Breed recognized shows prior to the current year with any owner. For horses in their first or second year of showing under English tack in USE/Equine Canada/WSH and/or Breed Association recognized shows. Horses of any age may be shown in standard English tack. Tack and attire shall be suitable to horse's type; martingales and training equipment prohibited. To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, trot/intermediate gait both ways of the arena. No extension of gaits shall be called for. May be asked to back. Judged on manners and performance 60%, quality and conformation 30%, and suitability of horse to rider 10%. May cross enter to Walk-Trot-Canter classes.

English Pleasure, Green Horse 1st & 2nd Yr. (No NEZ Pts.)

Eligibility requirements are based on a horse's prior participation in English classes at USE/Equine Canada/WSH and/or Breed recognized shows prior to the current year. For horses in their first or second year of showing under English tack in USE/Equine Canada/WSH and/or Breed Association recognized shows. Horses of any age may be shown in standard English tack. Tack and attire shall be suitable to horse's type; martingales and training equipment prohibited. To be shown at a walk, trot/intermediate gait, and canter both ways of the arena. No extension of gaits shall be called for. Shall not be asked to gallop or reverse at the canter. May be asked to back. Judged 60% on performance, 30% on conformation, and 10% on appointments. Cross entry is permitted into Walk-Trot and Walk-Trot-Canter classes.

English Pleasure, Green Rider, 1st & 2nd Yr., Walk-Trot (No NEZ Pts.)

Eligibility requirements are based on the rider's prior participation in English classes at USE/Equine Canada/WSH and/or Breed recognized shows prior to the current year. For riders in their first or second year of showing under English tack in USE/Equine Canada/WSH and/or Breed Association recognized shows. Horses of any age may be shown in standard English tack. Tack and attire shall be suitable to horse's type; martingales and training equipment prohibited. To be shown at a walk and trot/intermediate gait both ways of the arena. No extension of gaits shall be called for. May be asked to back. Judged 60% on performance, 30% on conformation, and 10% on appointments. Walk-Trot is restriction on the rider. Cross entry is permitted into Walk-Trot and Walk-Trot-Canter classes.

English Pleasure, Green Rider 1st & 2nd Yr.

Eligibility requirements are based on a riders prior participation in English classes at USE/Equine Canada/WSH and/or Breed recognized shows prior to the current year. For riders in their first or second year of showing under English tack in USE/Equine Canada/WSH and/or Breed Association recognized shows. Horses of any age may be shown in standard English tack. Tack and attire shall be suitable to horse's type; martingales and training equipment prohibited. To be shown at a walk, trot/intermediate gait, and canter both ways of the arena. No extension of gaits shall be called for. Shall not be asked to gallop or reverse at the canter. May be asked to back. Judged 60% on performance, 30% on conformation, and 10% on appointments. Restriction is on the rider. To be shown at walk, trot/intermediate gait and canter both ways of the arena. No extension of gaits shall be called for. Cross entry is permitted into Walk-Trot and Walk-Trot-Canter classes.

English Pleasure, Limit Horse

Open to horses who have not won six firsts in English Pleasure. Tack and attire shall be suitable to horse's type, martingale prohibited. To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, trot/intermediate gait, and canter. Judged on manners and performance 60%, quality and conformation 30% and suitability of horse to rider 10%. Cross entry is permitted into Walk-Trot and Walk-Trot-Canter classes.

English Pleasure, Limit Rider (No NEZ pts.)

Open to riders who have not won six firsts in English Pleasure. Tack and attire shall be suitable to horse's type, martingale prohibited. To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, trot/intermediate gait, and canter. Judged on manners and performance 60%, quality and conformation 30% and suitability of horse to rider 10%. Cross entry is permitted into Walk-Trot and Walk-Trot-Canter classes.

~ EQUITATION DIVISION ~

Hunter Seat Attire: A forward seat saddle with an appropriate bridle and any acceptable bit. Riders should wear coats of any tweed or Melton for hunting (conservative wash jackets in season), breeches or jodhpurs, and boots. Riders must wear a short or long-sleeved riding shirt with a choker or tie. When jackets are worn, a sleeveless shirt or dickey may be worn with the appropriate choker or tie. When Show Management and/or the Judge permits Riders may ride without jackets. All Riders are required to wear protective headgear; all Junior Exhibitors must wear an approved ASTM/SEI protective headgear properly fastened while mounted. English style spurs (with or without rowels) and bats or crops are optional. Judge may penalize those who do not conform.

Saddle Seat Attire: A flat English type saddle is required. A full bridle (curb and snaffle), pelham bridle, or Breed appropriate headstall and bit are equally acceptable. Martingales & tie-downs are prohibited. Conservative colors are recommended (black, blue, grey, dark burgundy, dark green, beige, or brown) with matching jodhpurs, derby or soft hat, and jodhpur boots. Day coats are permitted. Judge may not penalize for non-conventional colors.

Western Seat Attire: a standard Western saddle that fits the rider. acceptable bits include any standard Western bit; snaffles and bosals for junior horses 5 & under with rider using two hands is permitted. appropriate attire is required including western hat or ASTM/SEI approved helmets, pants (slacks, trousers, jeans), long sleeve shirt with collar (band, standup, tuxedo, etc.), neckwear (necklace, pin, tie, or decorated collar, etc.), and riding boots with a heel. chaps and spurs (with or without rowels) are optional. Females riding aside may wear split skirts. Incomplete attire is penalized.

Showmanship In Hand, English or Western, Jr. Ex. 18 & Under X

Showmanship In Hand, English or Western, Sr.-Amateur Ex. 19 & Over X

x Must be entered, shown and judged in these classes to be eligible for the Championship class.

Showmanship In Hand, Jr. Ex./Sr.-Amateur Championship

Showmanship In Hand, Green Handler 1st & 2nd Yr., English or Western, Jr. Ex./Sr.-Amateur

Showmanship In Hand, Limit Handler, English Or Western, Jr. Ex./Sr.-Amateur

Exhibitors will be asked to demonstrate their ability to lead, turn, set up and move their animals as the judge directs. The judge may ask exhibitors to perform other tests. Judges' techniques and procedures will vary. The following principles always apply: individual tests must be performed with official(s) involved in the test in the same relative position to each exhibitor. The exhibitor shall not stand directly in front of the horse. The exhibitor shall always lead, back, or move the horse from the left (near) side, unless otherwise specified in the pattern. All turns of 180 degrees or more shall be to the right, with the exhibitor walking to the right around the horse. Forehand turns of any degree to either direction are permissible. Quartering system is mandatory. Judges must penalize any exhibitor that does not demonstrate the quartering system. Horses may be shown according to breed type.

- Hunter attire and an appropriate bridle or plain leather halter with leather lead with or without chain. Bats or crops, and wearing spurs prohibited.
- Saddle seat attire and an appropriate bridle or show halter. Whips permitted. Wearing spurs prohibited.
- Western attire and an appropriate show halter and lead with or without chain. Wearing chaps and spurs prohibited.

Bareback Horsemanship, English or Western, Jr. Ex./Sr.-Amateur, Walk-Jog/Trot (No WSH Pts.)

Riders to wear appropriate English or Western riding apparel. Horses are to be worked both ways of the ring at a walk and jog/trot/intermediate gait. Riders may be asked for any additional tests the judge may deem necessary. Riders shall not be asked to dismount and mount. Judged on hands, seat, and suitability of horse to rider.

English Equitation, Green Rider 1st & 2nd Yr., Jr. Ex./Sr.-Amateur

To be shown at a walk/trot/intermediate gait, and canter both ways of the ring. Judged on hands, seat, and suitability of horse to rider. Cross entry is permitted to Walk-Trot and Walk-Trot-Canter classes.

Hunter Seat Equitation, Jr. Ex. 18 & Under (Not to Jump)

Hunter Seat Equitation, Sr.-Amateur Ex. 19 & Over (Not to Jump)

Competitors shall enter the ring and proceed around the ring at each gait and, on command, reverse and repeat. Riders may be asked to work collectively without stirrups in 14 & over and open classes. The order to reverse can be executed by turning toward or away from the rail. Light contact with horse's mouth is required. Entries then line up on command. Any or all riders may be required to execute any appropriate tests included in class requirements. Tests must be on the flat. Judges are encouraged to call for at least two (2) tests of the top contestants.

Options:

- a) Rail work showing three gaits (two for w/t) both directions and a backup either on the rail or in line up.
- b) Pattern work only, with no rail work required.
- c) A combination of pattern & rail work.

Saddle Seat & Saddle Seat Pleasure Equitation, Jr. Ex./Sr.-Amateur

Riders enter the ring turning to the right and proceed counterclockwise. The order to reverse can be executed by turning either towards or away from the rail. Entries will line up on command and any or all riders may be required to execute any appropriate tests included in class requirements. Judges are encouraged to call for at least two tests of the rail work and the individual tests. When individual tests are called for, the judge's opinion rests on a 50-50 analysis of the rail work and the individual tests. The fall of a horse or rider does not necessarily cause elimination but is penalized at the Judge's discretion. Judges may not penalize for non-conventional colors. Day coats are allowed.

Options:

- a) Rail work showing three gaits (two for w/t) both directions and a backup either on the rail or in line up.
- b) Pattern work only, with no rail work required.
- c) A combination of pattern & rail work.

Western Equitation, Green Rider 1st & 2nd Yr.

Riders enter the ring at a walk or jog/intermediate gait and are judged at a flat footed four-beat walk, two-beat jog/intermediate gait, and a three-beat lope both ways of the ring. Judged on hands, seat, and suitability of horse to rider.

Western Equitation, Jr. Ex. 18 & Under

Western Equitation, Sr.-Amateur Ex. 19 & Over

Riders enter the ring at a walk or jog/intermediate gait and are judged at a flat-footed four beat walk, two beat jog/intermediate gait, and a three beat lope both ways of the ring. The order to reverse may be executed by turning toward or away from the rail. All competitors are required to back in a straight line during the line up or on the rail. Judges are encouraged to call for a least two tests to be performed by competitors being considered for an award. Due to the difficulty of properly fitting tack, riders shall not be asked to change horses. Results as shown by the performance of the horse are not to be considered more important than the method used to obtain them. Riders will be judged on seat, hand, performance of horse, appointments of horse and rider, and suitability of horse to rider. Female riders astride may wear split skirts. Acceptable bits to include standard Western bits. Snaffles and bosals for junior horses 5 & under with rider using two hands is permissible.

Options:

- a) Rail work showing three gaits (two for w/t) both directions and a backup either on the rail or in line up.
- b) Pattern work only, with no rail work required.
- c) A combination of pattern & rail work.

~ WESTERN DIVISION~

Classes are open to horses, ponies, and mules, and may be shown by riders of any age. Junior exhibitors are restricted to mares and geldings. No cross entry is permitted between exhibitor age groups in this division. Cross entry between walk-jog and walk-jog-lope classes is permitted.

Standard Western bits are defined as having a shank with a maximum length overall of 8 1/2". Bars must be smooth, or latex wrapped. Jointed mouthpieces, half-breeds and spade bits are standard. Slip or gag bits, rigid donut mouthpieces and flat polo mouthpieces are prohibited.

Curb chains and leather chin straps may be used but must be flat, at least ½" wide, and lie flat against horse's jaw. No wire, rawhide, metal, or other substance can be used in conjunction with or as part of the leather chin strap or curb chain. A light lip strap is permissible

Standard snaffle bits are defined as a center jointed single rounded, smooth mouthpiece. The rings may be from 2" to 4" outside diameter of either the loose type, eggbutt, dee or center mounted without cheeks. The inside circumference of the ring must be free of rein, curb, or headstall attachment hooks. Bits may be latex wrapped. If a curb strap is used it must be attached below the reins.

A hackamore includes a bosal rounded in shape and constructed of braided rawhide or leather and must have a flexible nonmetallic core. Junior horses 5 & under may be shown in any class in a snaffle or bosal with rider using 2 hands.

Western Pleasure, Jr. Ex. 18 & Under, Walk-Jog (No WSH Pts.) Western Pleasure, Sr. Ex. 19 & Over, Walk-Jog (No WSH Pts.)

Horses are to be shown at a flat-footed, four-beat walk and free moving easy riding two-beat jog both ways of the ring on a reasonably loose rein without undue restraint. Extended gaits may be called for by the Judge. Special emphasis shall be placed on the walk. Horses may be asked to back at the Judge's discretion. All Horses chosen for a workout must be worked both ways of the ring at any gait requested by the Judge. Judged on performance 60%; conformation 30%, and appointments 10%.

Western Pleasure, Jr. Ex. 18 & Under X Western Pleasure, Sr. Ex. 19 & Over X

x Must be entered, shown and judged in these classes to be eligible for the Championship class.

Western Pleasure, Jr. Ex./Sr. Ex. Championship

Horses are to be shown at a flat-footed, four-beat walk; free moving easy riding two-beat jog, and three-beat lope both ways of the ring on a reasonably loose rein without undue restraint. Extended gaits may be called for by the Judge. Special emphasis shall be placed on the walk. Horses may be asked to back at Judge's discretion. All horses chosen for a workout must be worked both ways of the ring at any gait requested by the Judge. To be judged on performance 60%; conformation 30%, and appointments 10%.

Western Pleasure, Jr. Horse 5 & Under

Western Pleasure, Sr. Horse 6 & Over

Horses are to be shown at a flat-footed, four-beat walk, free moving easy riding two-beat jog, and three-beat lope both ways of the ring on a reasonably loose rein without undue restraint. Extended gaits may be called for by the judge. Special emphasis shall be placed on the walk. Horses may be asked to back at the judge's discretion. All horses chosen for a workout must be worked both ways of the ring at any gait requested by the judge. Judged on performance 60%; conformation 30%, and appointments 10%. Snaffles and bosals for junior horses 5 & under with rider using two hands is permitted.

Advanced Western Pleasure

To be shown at a walk, jog and lope. A minimum of three (3) or more additional tests must be included. Some examples of tests, but not limited to, may include the following: extension of gait, collection of gait, forehand/haunch turn, back, change direction, sidepass, loose rein, shoulders in/out, leg yield, 10 meter circle, counter lead at the lope and/or perform any other tests indicative of a highly trained pleasure horse. If a reverse at the lope is called for, exhibitors shall reverse and proceed on the lead specified by the judge. All horses must be allowed to attempt all requested tests. Horses should be agile, athletic, supple, prompt and willing, and show impulsion with calmness and good manners. Judged on performance and manners. No dropping of stirrups shall be permitted.

Western Pleasure, Colored Horses

Open to Albinos, Appaloosas, Buckskins, Duns, Grullas, Paints, Palominos and Pintos, who are not shown in Non-Color Western. Horses must show a recognizable coat and/or color pattern from a distance. To be shown according to breed type at a walk, jog/ intermediate gait, and lope, both ways of the ring on a reasonably loose rein, without undue restraint. Special emphasis on the walk. Judged 40% on colorful qualities, 40% performance and manners, and 20% on conformation.

Western Pleasure, Non-Colored Horses

Open to Horses who are not shown in Color Class Western. To be shown according to breed type at a walk, jog/ intermediate gait, and lope, both ways of the ring on a reasonably loose rein, without undue restraint. Special emphasis shall be placed on the walk. Judged on performance 60%, conformation 30%, and appointments 10%.

Western Pleasure, Green Horse 1st & 2nd Yr., Walk-Jog

Eligibility requirements are based on participation in Western classes at USE/Equine Canada/WSH and/or Breed recognized shows prior to the current year. For horses in their first or second year of showing under Western tack in USE/Equine Canada/WSH and/or Breed Association recognized shows. except, horses of any age may be shown in a standard Western bit (with one hand only) or in a ring snaffle or standard rawhide hackamore (two hands permitted). Tack and attire shall be suitable to horse's type; martingales and training equipment are prohibited. To be shown at a walk, and jog/intermediate gait, both ways of the arena. No extension of gaits shall be called for. May be asked to back. Judged 60% on performance, 30% on conformation, and 10% on appointments. Cross entry is permitted into Walk-Jog and Walk-Jog-Lope classes.

Western Pleasure, Green Horse 1st & 2nd Yr.

Eligibility requirements are based on a horse's prior participation in any type of Western Pleasure classes at USE/Equine Canada/WSH and/or Breed recognized shows prior to the current year with any owner. For horses in their first or second year of showing under Western tack in USE/Equine Canada/WSH and/or Breed Association recognized shows except, horses of any age may be shown in a standard Western bit (with one hand only) or in a ring snaffle or standard rawhide hackamore (two hands permitted). Tack and attire shall be suitable to horse's type; martingales and training equipment prohibited. To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, jog/intermediate gait and lope. No extension of gaits shall be called for. May be asked to back. Judged on manners and performance 60%, quality and conformation 30%, and suitability of horse to rider 10%. May cross enter to Walk-Jog-Lope classes.

Western Pleasure, Green Rider 1st & 2nd Yr., Walk-Jog

Eligibility requirements are based on a rider's prior participation in any type of Western Pleasure classes at USE/Equine Canada/WSH and/or Breed recognized shows prior to the current year. For riders in their first or second year of showing under Western tack in USE/Equine Canada/WSH and/or Breed Association recognized shows except, horses of any age may be shown in a standard Western bit (with one hand only) or in a ring snaffle or standard rawhide hackamore (two hands permitted). Tack and attire shall be suitable to horse's type; martingales and training equipment prohibited. To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, jog/intermediate gait. No extension of gaits shall be called for. May be asked to back. Judged on manners and performance 60%, quality and conformation 30%, and suitability of horse to rider 10%. Cross entry is permitted into Walk-Jog and Walk-Jog-Lope classes.

Western Pleasure, Green Rider 1st & 2nd Yr.

Eligibility requirements are based on a rider's prior participation in any type of Western Pleasure classes at USE/Equine Canada/WSH and/or Breed recognized shows prior to the current year. For riders in their first or second year of showing under Western tack in USE/Equine Canada/WSH and/or Breed Association recognized shows except, horses of any age may be shown in a standard Western bit (with one hand only) or in a ring snaffle or standard rawhide hackamore (two hands permitted). Tack and attire shall be suitable to horse's type; martingales and training equipment prohibited. To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, jog/intermediate gait and lope both ways of the arena. No extension of gaits shall be called for. May be asked to back. Judged on manners and performance 60%, quality and conformation 30%, and suitability of horse to rider 10%. May cross enter to walk, jog classes. Cross entry is permitted into Walk-Jog and Walk-Jog-Lope classes.

Western Pleasure, Limit Horse

Horses are to be shown at a flat-footed, four-beat walk; free moving easy riding two-beat jog and three-beat lope both ways of the ring on a reasonably loose rein without undue restraint. Extended gaits may be called for by the Judge. In pleasure classes special emphasis shall be placed on the walk. Horses may be asked to back at Judge's discretion. All horses chosen for a workout must be worked both ways of the ring at any gait requested by the Judge. To be judged on performance 60%; conformation 30%, and appointments 10%. Cross entry is permitted into Walk-Jog and Walk-Jog-Lope classes.

Western Pleasure, Limit Rider

Horses are to be shown at a flat-footed, four-beat walk; free moving easy riding two-beat jog, and three-beat lope both ways of the ring on a reasonably loose rein without undue restraint. Extended gaits may be called for by the Judge. In pleasure classes special emphasis shall be placed on the walk. Horses may be asked to back at Judge's discretion. All horses chosen for a workout must be worked both ways of the ring at any gait requested by the Judge. To be judged on performance 60%; conformation 30%, and appointments 10%. ross entry is permitted into Walk-Jog and Walk-Jog-Lope classes.

~ RANCH HORSE CLASSES ~

No hoof polish. No braided or banded manes or tail extensions. Trimming the inside of ears is discouraged. Trimming bridle path is allowed, as is trimming of fetlocks or excessive (long) facial hair. Silver on bridles and saddles is discouraged and will not count over a good working outfit. It is suggested competitors use a breast collar and a rear cinch. Attire should be conservative in nature

and reflect what would be seen on a working ranch. Embellished western pleasure attire is not allowed. Chaps and chinks are allowed.

Ranch Horse Conformation, Open

The purpose of Ranch Conformation is to present a well-mannered horse which reflects a positive combination of balance, structural correctness, and movement with appropriate breed and sex characteristics and adequate muscling. The ideal Ranch conformation horse should have a natural ranch horse appearance from head to tail. Horses are to be shown in a good working halter: rope, braided, nylon or plain leather. Horses may be shown in a leather lead shank with an attached chain either under or over the nose. Banding, braiding, hoof polish, tail extensions and trimming of ears are discouraged but will not be penalized.

Ranch Horse Trail, Open (No NEZ Pts.)

The Ranch Trail class should test the horse's ability to cope with situations encountered while being ridden through a pattern of obstacles generally found during the course of everyday ranch work. The horse/rider team is judged on the correctness, efficiency and pattern accuracy with which the obstacles are negotiated, and the attitude and mannerisms exhibited by the horse. Judging emphasis is on identifying the well broke, responsive and well-mannered horse which can correctly navigate and negotiate the course. The ideal ranch trail horse should have a natural ranch horse appearance from head to tail in each maneuver.

Ranch Rail, Open

Horses competing in Ranch Rail should reflect the versatility, attitude, and movement of a working horse. The horse's performance should simulate a horse riding outside the confines of an arena and that of a working ranch horse. This class should show the horse's ability to work at a forward and working speed while under control by the rider. Light contact should be rewarded, and horse shall not be shown on a full drape of reins. Allow posting and holding the saddle horn. The horse's head position should be elevated and above the level at all gaits. The overall manners and responsiveness of the horse while performing the maneuver requirements, and the horse's quality of movement are the primary considerations. The class will be worked both directions of the arena. Exhibitors will be asked to walk, extend the walk, jog, extend the jog, lope, extend the lope, stop from any gait, back, side pass to and from the rail, and turn of 180 degrees or greater. Any class size greater than 8 may be worked in lots at show management or judge's discretion depending on arena capacity and safety.

Ranch Riding, Open (AQHA Pattern #2)

The purpose of Ranch Riding should reflect the versatility, attitude, and movement of a working horse. The horse's performance should simulate a horse riding outside the confines of an arena and that of a working ranch horse. This class should show the horse's ability to work at a forward and working speed while under control by the rider. Light contact should be rewarded, and horse shall not be shown on a full drape of reins. Allow posting and holding the saddle horn. The horse's head position should be elevated and above the level at all gaits. The overall manners and responsiveness of the horse while performing the maneuver requirements, and the horse's quality of movement are the primary considerations. Each horse will work individually, performing both required and optional maneuvers, and scored based on 0 - 100, with 70 denoting an average performance. Each maneuver will receive a score, ranging from plus 1½ to minus 1½ that will be added or subtracted from 70 and is subject to a penalty that will be subtracted. Maneuver scores will be determined and assessed independently of penalty points. Required maneuvers will include the walk, trot, and lope in both directions, and the extended trot and extended lope in at least one direction, as well as stops and backs. Three optional maneuvers may include a side pass, turns of 360 degrees or more, changes of lead (simple or flying), walk, trot or lope over a pole(s), or some combination of maneuvers that it would be reasonable for a ranch horse to perform.

~ Trail Horse Classes ~

The same exhibitor may enter two or more horses and the same rider may elect to show more than one horse. However, a horse may not be ridden on the same course pattern twice.

Trail In Hand, Open

Open to any age or breed of horse, pony or mule. Cross entry to any other riding trail class with the same exhibitor is prohibited. The handler will lead the horse/pony/mule through, over and around the obstacles. Touching the horse will be penalized, but not necessarily disqualified. Horse shall be shown in a halter. Personal appointments are optional for the handler. To be shown at a walk and a trot. Obstacles will be according to WSH Western division. An exhibitor/horse who has a major fault may not place over a horse/exhibitor with any minor faults. All horses/exhibitors eligible will be placed.

Trail Horse, English or Western, Open

English or western tack and appointments. To be shown over and through obstacles at a walk, trot/jog/intermediate gait, and canter/lope, on a reasonably loose rein without undue restraint. Cross entry not allowed between age groups, this applies to both horse and rider. An exhibitor/horse who has a major fault may not place over a horse/exhibitor with any minor faults. All horses/exhibitors eligible will be placed.

~ SHOW HIGH POINT AWARDS ~

Eddie MacMurdo Memorial High Point Horse

Trophy to be awarded to the Horse/Rider combination accumulating the most points throughout the show. 4H/WAHSET/OHSET, Equitation, Horsemanship, Showmanship, Pairs, Ranch, Green Horse or Rider, and Limit Horse or Rider classes do not qualify for this award. This is a perpetual trophy that must be returned to the Walla Walla Valley Horsemen's Show Committee prior to next year's show; the winner will be presented a keeper trophy as their permanent trophy. It is the responsibility of the winner to have the next blank space engraved with their information in the same style as the previous winner.

All-Around High Point Jr. & Sr. Exhibitors

Trophies are awarded to the Jr. Ex. 18 Years & Under and the Sr. Ex. 19 Years & Over who accumulates the most points throughout the show. 4H/WAHSET/OHSET, Halter, Pairs, Ranch, Green Horse or Rider, and Limit Horse or Rider classes do not qualify for these awards.

High Point All Other Breed Stock Type and Non-Stock Type Horses

Awarded to the Horse/Rider combinations accumulating the most points throughout the show. 4H/WAHSET/OHSET, Equitation, Horsemanship, Showmanship, Pairs, Ranch, Green Horse or Rider classes, and Limit Horse or Rider classes do not qualify for these awards. Horses must be entered and shown in at least one All Other Breed class to qualify.

High Point 4-H/WAHSET/OHSET Member

Awarded to the Horse/Rider combination accumulating the most points in the 4-H/WAHSET/OHSET Member classes throughout the show.

High Point Green Rider

Awarded to the Horse/Rider combination accumulating the most points in the Green Rider classes throughout the show.

High Point English Horse

Awarded to the Horse/Rider combination, Jr. Ex. 18 Years & Under and Sr. Ex. 19 Years & Over, accumulating the most points in the English classes throughout the show. 4H/WAHSET/OHSET, Halter, Equitation, Horsemanship, Showmanship, Trail, Pairs, Green Horse or Rider, and Limit Horse or Rider classes do not qualify for these awards.

High Point Ranch Horse & Rider

Awarded to the Horse/Rider combination accumulating the most points in the Ranch classes throughout the show.

High Point Western Horse

Awarded to the Horse/Rider combinations, Jr. Ex. 18 Years & Under and Sr. Ex. 19 Years & Over, accumulating the most points in the Western classes throughout the show. 4H/WAHSET/OHSET, Halter, Equitation, Horsemanship, Showmanship, Trail, Pairs, Ranch, Green Horse or Rider and Limit Horse or Rider classes do not qualify for these awards.

~ SERIES HIGH POINT AWARDS ~

Must be entered, shown, and judged at both shows to be eligible for our Series High Point Awards.

All-Around Jr. Ex. 13 Years & Under and 14-18 Years All-Around Sr. Ex. 19-49 Years and 50 Yrs. & Over

4H/WAHSET/OHSET, Halter, Pairs, Ranch Horse, Green Horse or Rider, and Limit Horse or Rider classes do not qualify for these awards.

Award & ribbon to Winner; ribbon to Reserve. All Exhibitors entered in the show will have points counted from all designated point earning classes. In case of a tie, the winner will be the entry with the fewest classes. Points will be counted as follows:
