

General Rules

- 1. Members who wish to attend must submit their entry form to the WSCS <u>postmarked</u> no later than August 7. All fees will be <u>doubled</u> for those submitting entry forms after August 7.
- 2. No invitations will be required. Every member who meets criteria under "qualification" paragraph is automatically invited to the Washington State Championship Show (WSCS).
- 3. Qualification: You must be a member of Washington State Horsemen and have a five-time average to qualify in an event and compete at the Washington State Championship Show. An individual can ride multiple horses in individual events in the horse's correct classification. Team events individual can ride multiple teams but must make an appearance on a different horse.
- 4. All riders are required to obtain at least one sponsor for at least \$25. Sponsorships may be in the form of a program ad, cash donation, or a silent auction item that sells for at least \$25 (riders will need to pay difference for those selling under \$25). Sponsorships will not include welcome bag items although these are appreciated. Riders without a sponsorship must pay \$25 with their entry.
- 5. Contestant's age division shall be determined as of August 1, 2023. If new to WSHGD in 2023/24, your Zone Times Keeper should have requested age verification (driver's license or birth certificate).
- 6. The Washington State Horsemen, WSH Games Division, Chelan County Fairgrounds nor their officers, agents, or volunteers will be held responsible for accidents or injuries to contestants, horses, or spectators. Waivers on entry forms must be signed. Parent or legal guardian must sign for minors. Only <u>contestants</u> with signed waivers will be permitted to ride in the arena and/or on the grounds at any time during the weekend.
- 7. WSHGD reserves the right to reject or disqualify any entry because of disrespect of rules, abusive behavior towards an animal or another person, intoxication, or any other reasonable cause.
- 8. Event rules will be in accordance with the 2024 Washington State Horsemen Games Division Rulebook.
- 9. Any member wishing to file a protest must do so prior to the completion of the event (Flags, Poles, etc.) in which the situation occurred by filing a written description of the circumstances accompanied by a \$25.00 deposit with the Director. Upon completion of the last rider in the event, the event will be deemed "closed" and finalized in order for State Championships to be awarded.
- 10. Riders will not be permitted to approach any judges or timers for any reason regarding yourself or another party. Riders needing clarification or with concerns must approach one of the Show Stewards or the WSHGD Director. Stewards are Scott Howe, Terri Lowry, and Jessie McLaughlin.
- 11. Only officials working the current event are permitted in the announcer's stand during the show. Background music for teams is encouraged. Download the music to a smart phone and arrange for the team's representative to arrive at the announcer's booth at the beginning of the Team Event (along with your audio jack).
- 12. Entry fee refunds will be made only with a signed statement from a doctor or a veterinarian.
- 13. Riding in the rodeo arena will **NOT** be permitted on Thursday. Open riding will be from 8:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. on Friday. Exercising may be done in the warm-up area (track) on Thursday or outside of the hours listed for Friday. No running, racing, or quick turning on the track at any time.
- 14. There will be no riding double at Grand entry at the Washington State Championship Show.
- 15. Western attire is required during this competition. Riders are to wear neat western attire to include western pants (no cutoffs, shorts, or sweats), long-sleeved, short-sleeved, or sleeveless western shirt or shirts (long, short, or sleeveless) reflecting chosen theme for the show / team design, and western boots or sports riding tennis shoes with heel. Shirts must have a collar and snaps, buttons, or zipper and be fastened with fasteners at the beginning of the run. Riders are allowed to wear western hats however baseball caps and/or visors are not permitted.
- 16. Camping facilities are available however hookups including electricity and water are limited. The cost for camping is \$23 per night (trailers and RVs), and \$10 per night (tents without services). The charge is what the Chelan County Fairgrounds is charging WSHGD...no additional fees have been added in. The cost is <u>PER</u> night and <u>PER</u> unit. All overnighters must pay for camping if staying on Chelan County property. This year, if desiring to camp up above (tent, RV, truck, etc.) without guaranteed services, the cost will be \$50.00 per night.
- 17. Horses are NOT PERMITTED in the campground.
- 18. No bicycles will be permitted in or around the horses.
- 19. Dogs must be on a leash at all times and pet owners are responsible to pick up after their pet. Pet owners that fail to pick up after their pets and/or those with dogs off leash will be assessed a \$25.00 fine per occurrence.
- 20. Each Zone will be assigned a specific area of the facility to monitor for cleanliness during the weekend and to complete a final sweep / clean of that area on Sunday before dismissal. Working together, this keeps the responsibility of finding the facility better than we found it to ALL participants rather than just a small few.

Entries

Entry Fees are \$3.00 per event plus a one-time \$5.00 arena fee (per person). When sending in your fees, riders will need to pay \$3.00 per event they will be riding in (individual, two-man, and four-man). Four-Man Team Captains need to include the Team Sheet found in this packet along with their registration but each rider will pay individually for their rides. Programs

Programs will be available at a cost of \$6.00 each. The souvenir program includes the event order, rider's order in each event (along with average), and ads from our sponsors. Additional programs will not be ordered this year, so please be sure to include it on your entry form.

Stalls

The cost of stalls this year is \$20.00 per night per stall (indoor) or \$15.00 per night per stall (outdoor). Shavings are NOT provided; all users will need to bring their own shavings. Additionally, users are required to haul manure / dirty shavings to the designated refuse areas. Those failing to do so will forfeit their \$25.00 deposit check. Stalls and pens should be reserved through Melissa Kelsey. If you have not already reserved a pen or stall, contact her at mkaquatherapy@gmail.com to determine availability. The form and payment (found on last page) should then be mailed to: Melissa Kelsey, 1915 W Antler Rd – Deer Park WA 99006. Stalls / pens will be assigned first come, first serve based upon payments received. A limited number of stock pens are also available for \$30.00.

Judges / Timers

Jessie McLaughlin will be coordinating judging and timing this year working around the events that you ride in. We do not want to overwhelm any of our hard-working officials by leaving them in the arena all 3 days but we are small in numbers on officials. Thank you in advance for your willingness to help!

River Float

One of the annual highlights is the Wenatchee River Float (Cashmere to Monitor). Depending on the river level, the hope is to once again float the river on Thursday afternoon. Bring your tubes and your life jackets and let's hope the river is high enough. If it isn't high enough...let's plan to hit the water somewhere! Ideas?

Color of the Day

Rather than a color of the day this year, we are SUPER excited to see your Hawaiian shirts! They still need to fit our attire dress code of collar and snaps or buttons. We'll select a team of judges that will be on the hunt this year for the BRIGHTEST shirt each day (or maybe the COOLEST)...it will be up to them. Check your thrift stores – they are a great location to pick up some beautiful Hawaiian shirts!

Arena Help Fun

Rather than assigning events to each rider to help with, we thought we'd make it fun and rewarding! Stay tuned for how this year's arena help bonus event will run. Just know the more you help, the better your chances!

Saturday Night Fun

The silent auction is always a hit and part of Saturday night's entertainment. If bringing items, be sure to turn them in at time of check-in. A huge "thank you" to Jackie Bicondova for helping coordinate this last year! The Junior Riders under the direction of Junior Rider Representatives Ellie Snyder and Hunter Coe will be hosting a fun event Saturday night. Maybe it will even have a Hawaiian flare to it...anyone up for a Hula Contest? When they've got the event finalized, will ship out a message to this year's contestants letting them know what the event is and if you'll want to bring something from home to make participating even more fun! Stay tuned...

Awards

EVENT AWARDS: There will be a "State Champion" plaque given in each event in each age division (team events are not split by age division) to the rider with the fastest time overall. Classification (A, B, C, D, Buck, LL) places 1st through 6th will be given in each event. Ties will be honored in all six (6) placings. No reruns or flip of a coin to determine placings. The committee will also be putting together event placing mementos. WSCS event awards will be handed out by the WSCS Committee.

HIGH POINT AWARDS: Each horse / rider combination to be placed on one list according to their times run in individual events. Times will be placed in their appropriate age divisions after the show. Points figured according to place (10 for 1st, 8 for 2nd, 6 for 3rd, 5 for 4th, 4 for 5th, 3 for 6th, 2 for 7th, and 1 for 8th). High Point awards will be decided according to sponsors collected. With one saddle sponsor received, saddle will go to "all around horse"; with two saddle sponsors collected saddles will go to High Point Junior and High Point Senior; with eight saddle sponsors received saddles will go to High Point winners - Buckaroo through Super Senior C age divisions. Leadline will receive a special award. For all High Point Awards (includes age group, high point individual, and all-around horse) in case of any ties the tie will be broken by giving the award to the person with the most first places. If this does not break the tie, the person then with the most 2nd places will become the winner. Tie-breaking method (as outlined in the WSHGD Rulebook) will continue down through 3rds, 4ths, 5ths, cumulative times, etc. until the tie is broken.

<u>WSCS AWARDS</u>: After the WSCS, the committee will e-mail out a flyer to all riders that placed listing how many points they received (6 points for 1st, 5 for 2nd, 4 for 3rd, 3 for 4th, 2 for 5th, 1 for 6th) and what each point is worth (per point value). They will have a list of awards they can choose from. This award will then be purchased by the Committee Chair and presented at the Washington State Horsemen Convention at the Clover Island Inn in Kennewick, November 8-10.

NOTE: All proceeds from the arena entry fees, sponsorships for events, and WSH Games Division ride fee allocations will be remitted into awards. The only exception will be for small administrative costs as determined appropriate by the WSCS Committee Chair. A small amount will be carried over to the next year. A complete financial statement will be available at the WSH Convention.

SPECIAL AWARDS: The following awards are given as special awards from the WSH Games Division at Convention. All awards (with the exception of the Record-Breaking Run Award) are figured using the point scale of 10, 8, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, 1.

- Games Club of the Year Award Perpetual trophy. Calculation Method: Clubs sending riders to the WSCS must supply the WSCS
 Committee Chair with a current membership roster at least two weeks prior to the WSCS. Riders belonging to more than one club
 must designate which club they are riding for. Independent W.S.H. members with no club affiliations may not pledge their Washington
 State Championship Show points to a club.
- Champion Individual Event Games Horse Award Perpetual trophy and special award. Calculation Method: Junior, Intermediate, Senior A, Senior B, Super Senior A, and Super Senior B individual event horses to be placed on one list according to times, only top placings in each individual event only to be counted.
- Champion All-Around Games Horse Award / Ought to Be a Dancer Memorial Perpetual trophy and special award. Calculation
 Method: Junior, Intermediate, Senior A, Senior B, Super Senior A, and Super Senior B horses to be placed on one list according to
 times. Horse must receive individual and team points. Only top placings in each event to be counted. In addition to this point scale,
 each rider / horse combination will receive one point per event that they qualified and rode in at the WSCS.
- Record-Breaking Run Award Perpetual and permanent plaques.
- High Point Individual Event Leadline Games Horse Perpetual plaque.
- High Point Individual Event Buckaroo Games Horse Perpetual plaque.
- High Point Individual Event Junior Games Horse / Zara Fichtner Memorial Perpetual plaque.
- High Point Individual Event Intermediate Horse Perpetual plaque.
- High Point Individual Event Senior A Horse Perpetual plaque.
- High Point Individual Event Senior B Horse Perpetual plaque.
- High Point Individual Event Super Senior A Horse Perpetual plaque.
- High Point Individual Event Super Senior B Horse Perpetual plaque.
- High Point Individual Event Super Senior C Horse Perpetual plaque.
